<b>Ratios and Group Size</b>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on the average adult/child ratio and group size in each classroom. Highest points are awarded to classrooms with small group sizes and more adults per child.</p> <p>Notes: Meza Family Child Care meets Title 22 Regulations for ratio.</p>	
<b>Program Environment Rating Scale(s)</b>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on assessment scores using a tool that measures health and safety, quality of materials, room arrangement, schedules, and interactions in the classroom and program.</p> <p>Note: An independent FCCERS assessment was conducted at Meza Family Child Care.</p>
