<p><b>Effective Teacher-Child Interactions: CLASS Assessments</b></p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on assessment scores using a tool that measures teaching quality in the areas of: emotional support, classroom organization, and instructional support.            Note: <b>An independent CLASS assessment was conducted at Montera Elementary SP.</b></p>	
<p><b>Ratios and Group Size</b></p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on the average adult/child ratio and group size in each classroom. Highest points are awarded to classrooms with small group sizes and more adults per child.            Notes: <b>Montera Elementary SP has a 1:8 ratio with group size not to exceed 20 children.</b></p>	
<p><b>Program Environment Rating Scale(s)</b></p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on assessment scores using a tool that measures health and safety, quality of materials, room arrangement, schedules, and interactions in the classroom and program.
