<p>Child Observation</p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on program’s method of assessing children’s learning; and for planning learning experiences to meet each child’s needs. Notes: SBCUSD San Andreas CDC uses DRDP assessment tool on all children and results are used to inform curriculum.</p>	
<p>Development and Health Screenings</p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on how the program works with families to ensure all children receive an annual health screening, a developmental screening, and referrals for follow up, if necessary. Notes: SBCUSD San Andreas CDC meets Title 22 Regulations and all children receive a health screening annually.</p>	
<p>Minimum Qualifications for Lead Teacher/Family Child Care Home (FCCH)</p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on teachers’ professional development and formal education. Highest points are awarded to teachers who hold a Bachelor’s degree or higher. Notes: Lorena Rodriguez-Peterson holds a Child Development Site Supervisor Permit, Bachelor’s degree and attends professional development trainings.</p>	
<p>Effective Teacher-Child Interactions: CLASS Assessments</p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on assessment scores using a tool that measures teaching quality in the areas of: emotional support, classroom organization, and instructional support. Note: An independent CLASS assessment was conducted at SBCUSD San Andreas CDC.</p>	
<p>Ratios and Group Size</p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on the average adult/child ratio and group size in each classroom. Highest points are awarded to classrooms with small group sizes and more adults per child. Notes: San Andreas CDC has a 3:24 ratio with group size not to exceed 24 children.</p>	
<p>Program Environment Rating Scale(s)</p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on assessment scores using a tool that measures health and safety, quality of materials, room arrangement, schedules, and interactions in the classroom and program. Note: An independent ECERS assessment was conducted at San Andreas CDC.</p>	
<p>Director Qualifications</p>	<p>1-5 points are awarded based on the director’s professional development and formal education. Highest points are awarded to directors who hold an Administrative Credential or Master’s degree. Notes: Latashia Kelly holds a Master’s degree and attends professional development trainings.</p>
